Proposed Requirements: Fishing catch and effort reported weekly. Reporting frequency for headboats may increase.

Program Start Date: TBD, waiting on the rule making period. Once the Gulf plan is implemented, then vessels with jointly held SA/GOM permits must always submit according the GOM regulations.

Proposed Requirements: Hail-out with expected return date/time and location, permanently affixed GPS device that is always "on", and landings must be reported prior to offload of fish. Headboats must report more rapidly.
