

Snapper Grouper Sea Turtle and Smalltooth Sawfish Release Gear Requirements



Why do I have to carry sea turtle and smalltooth sawfish release gear?

The snapper grouper fishery in the South Atlantic Region is known to interact with endangered and threatened sea turtles and smalltooth sawfish. In order for the snapper grouper fishery to be exempt from the take prohibitions established in the Endangered Species Act (ESA), the National Marine Fisheries Service has to comply with a set of terms and conditions that implemented measures for sea turtle handling protocols and/or guidelines for the commercial and for-hire sectors.

What does the ESA-listed sea turtles and smalltooth sawfish release protocol require onboard for commercial and for-hire snapper grouper vessels?

“Careful Release Protocols for Sea Turtle Release with Minimal Injury.”

Must be possessed inside the wheelhouse or within a waterproof case.
