Amendment #31 Joint South Atlantic and Gulf of Mexico Generic Headboat Reporting Amendment	1/27/2014	The amendment required headboat vessels fishing in the South Atlantic for snapper grouper, dolphin and wahoo, and coastal migratory pelagics to submit weekly electronic fishing records to the Southeast Fisheries Science Center Science and Research Director, or at intervals shorter than a week, if notified by the Science and Research Director.
Regulatory Amendment #14	12/8/2014	-Changed the commercial and recreational fishing year for greater amberjack from May 1 through April 30, to March 1 through the end of February; -Changed the commercial fishing year for black sea bass from June 1 through May 31, to January 1 through December 31Changed the recreational fishing year for black sea bass from June 1 through May 31, to April 1 through March 31; -Specified a 300 pound gutted weight commercial trip limit for black sea bass using hook-and-line gear from January 1 to April 30.
