Focus: Permit renewals delayed because of missing reports

o Late data may have inaccuracies

- Dealer permits (GSAD Gulf and South Atlantic Dealer)
- Vessel permits (Snapper/Grouper, King Mackerel, Spanish Mackerel, Atlantic Dolphin and Wahoo)



Commercial Reporting

Missing reports must be submitted for a permit to be renewed

Permit owner notified that permit will expire 2 months in advance.

Permit owner applies for permit renewal

Reporting period = start of permit to one year later or start of permit to date of application to renew

Renewal reports = reports from reporting period submitted after application to renew is received



Gulf and South Atlantic Dealer (GSAD) Permits

- Effective August 7, 2014, the Gulf and South Atlantic Dealer (GSAD) permit was created.
- Under the GSAD, dealers are required to electronically submit a weekly report by midnight each Tuesday for the previous Sunday through Saturday.
- Dealers cannot renew GSAD permits until reports are received for every week during the reporting period.
- SEFSC summarized all species caught from ME-FL Keys reported electronically by the dealer, not just federally-managed species.
