NC and Maryland: report through a state program, via a catch card and tagging process

Program Start Date: TBD, waiting on the final rule Proposed Requirements: Hail-out with expected return date/time and location, permanently affixed GPS device that is always "on", and landings must be reported prior to offload of fish. Headboats must report more rapidly.


