



MyFishCount is a Pilot Platform for Recreational Fisherman to report red snapper catches in the South Atlantic region. Assist state and federal samplers by allowing them to sample your fish back at the dock or through carcass collection program. More information can be found on state and federal data collection programs for red snapper at the South Atlantic Fishery Management Council's website.

The platform is designed for individual fisherman to report their own catch.

Create Trips from Mobile Website

MyFishCount allows you to create trips from a mobile website. You can specify the area you are departing from, your method of fishing, details of your trip and more.



Log Your Catch

Once a trip is created, you can make as many catch logs as you want for red snapper during the miniseason. You can add details about your catch including location, length, weight, and release condition of the fish. These data are included as part of your trip and available for your reference at any time.



View Past Trips

You can view past trips in one central location. The data can be downloaded as a CSV to allow for convenient storage on your computer.

Currently, there are over 100 people registered to use the web portal, MyFishCount. Below are some tables and charts you might find interesting based on your reports.




MyFishCount Preliminary Results




Kept or Released and Reason for Release





- Ensure data are acceptable for submission to regional database.
