Dear Mr. Michaels:

The South Atlantic Fishery Management Council is pleased to provide the following comments:

- The South Atlantic Council has supported Secretarial (NMFS) development of SAFE reports in the past and continues that support today. We believe development of SAFE reports should be a Secretarial responsibility, with the Councils assisting in the development as agreed to and specified in a Regional Operating Agreement, Memorandum of Understanding or some other joint agreement between the Council, Regional Office and Science Center;
- It is critical that the Councils be provided with <u>annual SAFE</u> reports to meet the new requirements of the RMSA;
- We fully support including the recommendations that are provided by the Scientific and Statistical Committee in the SAFE report based on their new responsibilities as specified in the RMSA;
- SAFE reports should also include (reference) the information in the latest stock assessment for the species addressed, presented in a format conducive to use by the Councils for making management decisions;
- All data provided in the SAFE reports should be updated annually;
- The SAFE report should determine when the <u>only</u> science, stock assessment or other information available to the Councils is of such a poor quality that it should <u>not be</u> considered the "best science available". In other words, there should be minimum standards developed to determine what constitutes "best science available" for a Council to use in making management decisions;
- National Standard 2 should be flexible in addressing how each Council establishes its stock assessment and peer review processes and how these processes are integrated into the function of the SSC.
