Mid-Atlantic Input on SEDAR Benchmark Assessment for Atlantic Blueline Tilefish

SSC and Council TOR Comments

- 1. Regardless of the outcome of the stock identification analysis, separate fishing level recommendations (OFL/ABCs) should be provided for the areas north and south of the Virginia/North Carolina border (i.e., the TORs should request a spatially-explicit model for the 2 management areas.)
- 2. If the assessment working group determines that the data north of North Carolina are inadequate to support an analytic assessment of the population in the Mid-Atlantic, then the assessment should be truncated at the VA/NC border.
- 3. Because the data available for a new Blueline Tilefish assessment may be limited, the TORs should include a provision that includes evaluation of data limited methods to provide ABC recommendations.
- 4. Ecosystem considerations should be incorporated into TORs to inform development of biological reference points.
- 5. The issue of climate change may be very important relative to this species, a TOR or some consideration of the impact of environmental factors on BLT abundance and distribution should be added, especially as it relates to potential range shifts.
