Background and Need

- Rapidly Developing Winter Atlantic Bluefin Tuna (ABT) Fishery mid-90's (no other sampling program in place during Jan-Feb)
- LPS/MRFSS Surveying Initiated During 1996
 - Surveys Conducted For 2 years
 - Results Lacked Industry Support And Were Very Controversial
 - Resulted in ABT Fishery Closures
- Led To Development Of Carcass Tagging Program (census)





- Carcass Tagging Program Developed by Charterboat Captains, Anglers, NMFS, and DMF
- Meetings Held To Work-Out Process
- Mandatory Reporting Established By NMFS (50CFR635)
 - All ABT Landed Must Be Reported



Approach (cont')

ABT Reporting Stations (25) Established Coastwide

- Catch Card Must be Completed In Exchange For Landing Tag
- Only Tagged Fish May Be Removed From Vessel
- Port Agents Collect Cards When Needed
- Weekly Summaries to NMFS (web-based access to landings)

Census verses Estimate



Landing Tags and Catch Cards (The Bigger Picture)

- Census versus Estimate
 - Used where estimates highly variable
 - Not applicable for common species
 - Specialized Fisheries (area/targets)
 - Availability of Results (weekly or less if needed)
 - Simple Design (public understanding)
 - Angler, Captain, and Industry Participation
 - Requires Less Funding



Needed Improvements

Outreach

- News Releases, Fishing Club Contacts
- Internet Access to Landings and Reporting requirements
- Reporting Station Expansion
- Validation of Results
 - Law Enforcement (coordinate with NMFS Enforcement)
 - Port Agent Sampling (utilize dockside validation)
- Continued QA and QC



Limitations of Tagging Program

- Catch rate only available for harvest (number released not obtained)*
- No Socio-Economic Data*
- No Angler Demographics*
- No Measures of Uncertainty

*Additional reporting requirements could affect compliance



Implementing Regional Catch Card Program

Program Administration

- Secure Support From States
 - 2016 ACCSP/State Conduct Intercept Survey
- Engage Council/NOAA/STATES Outreach Systems
- Consider National Program For Reporting Rare Event
 Species
 - Catch Card Onsite Reporting
 - Electronic Offsite Reporting



Implementing Regional Catch Card Program

Development and Implementation

- Determine Which Species to Include
- Evaluate Magnitude and Geographic Distribution of Catch to be Reported Region Wide
- Design Catch Cards
- Identify Reporting Stations
 - Prominent Marinas Near Inlets
