OVERVIEW

1. Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary Restoration Blueprint

Description: The Council will receive a presentation on proposed regulatory changes affecting the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary as a result of NOAA's comprehensive review of the management plan, zoning plan, and regulations for the Sanctuary. The Council's advisory panels and the Council received presentations during fall 2019 and in December 2020 meeting, respectively, and comments on the Draft Environmental Impact Statement were submitted in March 2020 (*Attachment 1a*). The proposed rule, the next step in the process, published on July 18, 2022, with a 100-day comment period ending on October 26, 2022 (*Attachment 1b*; https://floridakeys.noaa.gov/blueprint/). The GMFMC requested and received approval for an extension until February 17, 2023. FKNMS staff will provide an overview of proposed changes (*Attachment 1c*).

Required Council Action: Consider commenting on the proposed changes and requesting an extension to respond until December 21, 2022. This would allow discussion by APs and finalizing the response at the December SAFMC meeting. If a comment is desired, provide guidance on topics and positions.

2. Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) Update on FKNMS Proposed Rule (*Attachment 2*)

Description: The FWC has closely followed fishery management issues related to the Sanctuary Blueprint and taken the lead in highlighting items that could impact Council managed fisheries as the process has developed over the last several years. FWC has provided a presentation to highlight fishery impacts.

Required Council Action: No specific action; consider the presentation in light of possible SAFMC comments.

3. Western Central Atlantic Fisheries Commission Working Groups (*Attachments 3a and 3b*)

Description: WECAFC operates as a regional fisheries body under the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations. It is an advisory body aiming to promote effective conservation, management, and development of living marine resources in the Wider Caribbean. The Council will receive an overview of outcomes from the recent meeting (WECAFC 18). In addition, WECAFC's work program now includes a meeting of the Flyingfish-Dolphinfish Working Group tentatively scheduled for early 2023. Goals of this working group include identifying regional needs and priorities, highlighting areas for potential collaboration, and developing a work plan and recommendations for future activities.

Required Council Action: provide input on possible U.S. objectives and outcomes for the 2023 meeting of the Flyingfish-Dolphinfish Working Group.
