The Southeast Fisheries Science Center has provided the following **preliminary landings estimates** for species in the South Atlantic Fishery Management Council's area of jurisdiction subject to quota management through August 15, 2010.

b. Atlantic Spanish mackerel quota (%) is based on the adjusted quota of 3,620,000 lbs.

c. Given the early closure on the Gulf king mackerel Eastern Zone-East Coast subzone on February 4, 2010, the National Marine Fisheries Service reopened the fishery from March 3-7, 2010.

d. The trip limit for golden tilefish was reduced to 300 lbs gutted weight on March 18, 2010, and the fishery closed on April 12, 2010.

e. Confidential landings.

f. The Dolphin Wahoo Fishery Management Plan established a 1.5 million-pound cap for the dolphin commercial fishery for both northeast and southern Atlantic regions. During January 1 through May 31, 2010, 4.91% of the 1.5 million-pound cap was landed (73,711 pounds).

Octooral landings are reported twice a year with final landings reported by May of the next year; therefore, these are the total landings for both Atlantic (20 trips) and Gulf (28 trips) in federal waters for 2010, reported in number of colonies.
