Did Not Fish Vessel Trip Reports

Focus on For-hire permitted vessels

- Weekly submissions during active fishing months
- Vessels can identify longer periods of inactivity
- Provide signed statement of no fishing effort
- Supports evaluating logbook reporting compliance with or without an MRIP APAIS dockside intercept



Aligning regional initiatives

- South Atlantic commercial
- SEFHIER South Atlantic
- ACCSP For-hire logbook methodology
- MRIP estimate use in stock assessment
- Standardizing federal logbooks (FIS project)

Objectives

- Coastwide coordination ME-FL
- Integrate with MRIP statistics
- Utilize for-hire logbooks for effort and catch
- Improve accuracy and precision of catch statistics by for-hire fisheries



ACCSP For-hire Methodology: Objectives

- More fully utilize For-hire logbooks in MRIP catch statistics
- Maintain compatible designs on Atlantic coast
 - Logbook frame & Survey frame = Total For-hire catch
- Complete design prior to regulations & implementation
 - Electronic logbook design components (with DNF)
 - APAIS dockside survey for validation
 - Calculation method for catch and effort statistics
- Develop & certify ONCE, with multiple implementations
- Allow for phased implementation on Atlantic Coast as
 logbook programs adopt MRIP certified design

For-hire Methodology Technical Review: Areas of Agreement:

- Follows probability sampling design
- ✓ All states utilize consistent APAIS design
- Clarify APAIS used for estimation AND validation
- Estimators appropriately weight sample data
- Estimators allow proper estimation of variance
- No new concerns beyond APAIS/FHTS on coverage of target population
- High logbook reporting compliance = small bias in sampling design sensitivity
- Many components same or similar to other certified MRIP designs



For-hire Methodology Technical Review: Ongoing work

- Did Not Fish (DNF) Reports
 RTC: Include
- Declarations (Hail-outs)
 RTC: Do not require allow optional component
- Vessel Frame

RTC: Identify categories of vessels moving between

• Use of APAIS as required estimation component RTC: Clarify tasks for data analysis (via Contract)



Did Not Fish Vessel Trip Reports

Focus on For-hire permitted vessels
