At the September 2019 meeting the SAFMC directed staff to develop an abbreviated framework to just be an ACL definition action

- b) ✓Staff provide SEDAR working paper: Summary: Habitat and Developing Spatial Species Information for Blueline Tilefish in the South Atlantic Region
- c) ✓SEDAR 50 Assessment – dissemination to Council in September 2017
- d) ✓SSC review – October 2017.

- f) ✓Blueline Tilefish ABC Webinar - February 23, 2018

- i) ✓The SSC was going to review blueline tilefish at the January 25, 2019 webinar which was rescheduled and took place February 25, 2019. Based on the review the SSC decided not to use the revision assessment to update the ABC recommendation they made after SEDAR 50.
- j) ✓At their April 2019 meeting, the SSC reaffirmed their previous ABC recommendations from SEDAR 50 and the blueline tilefish ABC Workgroup. Therefore, the SSC recommended that progress could commence on Amendment 38 at the June 2019 Council meeting to consider options to implement a new ABC for blueline tilefish in the South Atlantic. The revised ABC and ACL would be based on recommendations for the southern area developed as part of SEDAR 50 in combination with the approved Workgroup recommendations for the area north of Cape Hatteras, North Carolina.

- k) ✓ At the June Committee meeting, Council staff presented background on catch level recommendations for blueline tilefish and options to implement these catch levels. Recommendations are based on results of the SEDAR 50 assessment and the acceptable biological catch (ABC) for the area between Cape Hatteras and the North Carolina/Virginia border.

System Management Plans

The System Management Plans (SMP) are intended to increase the dialogue among the SAFMC and NOAA, commercial and recreational fishers, other members of affected communities, scientists, and additional agencies and stakeholders to achieve common goals to effectively monitor and protect the resources found within the Oculina Experimental Closed Area (OECA), Deepwater Marine Protected Areas (MPAs), and Spawning Special Management Zones (SMZs).

Ecopath with Ecosim Model of the South Atlantic Region: July 2019 - June 2020

A SAFMC **Ecopath Modeling Team** comprised of FWRI staff, Council staff, and other technical experts as needed is established. FWRI in cooperation with SAFMC will maintain the model and support the Ecospecies online species information system as the long-term repository for the processed inputs and outputs associated with the South Atlantic Ecopath with Ecosim model.

An **Ecopath Model Review Workgroup** comprised of selected members of the SSC will, provide an initial review of the model focusing on: the overall base model including the appropriateness of data and decisions made; providing input on what analyses/applications the model should/can be used for; and direction on the formulation

of more focused dynamic simulations or sub-models. Selection of a Chair and finalization of the Terms of Reference (TOR) for the Workgroups review was accomplished in December 2019 setting the stage for the review via webinar between January and March 2020.

SAFMC Citizen Science Pilot Project – Scamp Discards

Work began on the pilot project that will work with fishermen and scientists to develop a sampling design and protocol for development of a mobile phone app to collect data on discards of scamp grouper in the for-hire, private recreational, headboat, and commercial fishery. Tasks completed to date include:

- February 2018 – project management planning meetings with project partners (ACCSP, Harbor Light Software, Citizen Science Association)
- March 2018 – Action Teams began work on creating a Project Development Plan, Volunteer Training Plan, Communication Plan and Data Management Plan for the project

- December 2018 – Review of the Release app by the Citizen Science Committee
- March/April 2019 – Beta testing of SAFMC Release evaluation app
- May/June – Development of website, training materials, promotional materials, potential participant list, SAFMC Release app launched
- June 2019 – present: recruiting fishermen to participate in project; data collection and QA/QC underway; refining evaluation metrics; pursuing additional grant opportunities to expand and promote app

FISHstory Project - This project, funded through the NOAA FIS grant competition, will document historical catch and length estimates using historic photos from 1940s – 70s from the headboat fleet in Daytona Beach, FL. The project will use an online crowdsourcing platform (Zooniverse) to build a project that will allow citizens to be trained to identify species in the images. Once species are verified, one key species will be selected for length analysis to document lengths. The project is anticipated to begin in Spring 2019. Tasks completed to date include:

- Scanner purchased, contract established with DSF, Inc. and remaining historic photos are being scanned, compiled, and archived; photo scanning completed in August 2019
- FISHstory project coordinator hired; start date: July 1, 2019
