SEFHIER Background Information



- Federal for-hire electronic reporting began Jan, 2021
- Applicable South Atlantic/Atlantic federal permits:
 - South Atlantic Charter/Headboat for Coastal Migratory Pelagic fish (CHS)
 - Atlantic Charter/Headboat for Dolphin/wahoo (CDW)
 - South Atlantic Charter/Headboat for Snapper-grouper fish (SC)
- Permit requirements differ among the Gulf and S. Atl. programs (the Gulf program had more requirements)
- Permit renewal withheld for non-reporting as of 4/29/2022

SEFHIER Program Goals

- ❖ Produce reliable estimates of catch & effort for federally permitted for-hire vessels
- Immediate data uses validate minimum catch & effort estimates
- Future data use requires calibration and benchmarking to existing data collections
- Anticipated benefits of SEFHIER:
 - Improved for-hire data, for management:
 - ✓ Increased accuracy & timeliness
 - ✓ Census-based reporting
 - ✓ Reduction in recall bias
 - Improved monitoring & compliance





(Required) SEFHIER Logbook Fields

- Trip Detail Fields:
 - **Vessel** ID/permit group (for SA or Gulf form)
 - Captain First & Last Name
 - Trip Type (Charter, Headboat, Commercial, Recreational)
 - Trip Activity (Fishing Yes/No; Trip w/o Effort)
 - Trip Start/End Date & Time
 - End Port
- Passenger and Economic Questions:
 - # of Anglers
 - # of Paying Passengers
 - # of Crew

- Trip Fee
- Fuel Used
- Price per Gallon

- Primary Gear
- Primary Target Species
- Fishing Hours
- Fishing Depth
- Fishing Location (Lat/Long)
- Species Caught and/or Discarded







SEFHIER Outreach & Communication

- Outreach efforts to promote compliance:

- Communicating reporting requirements for dual South Atlantic/Atlantic and Gulf Permitted Vessels
 - "Reminders about Reporting Requirements for Vessels with Commercial and Federal For-Hire Permits" went out as a <u>Fishery Bulletin</u> on 10/26/2023
- How to add/modify SEFHIER required fields (e.g. add shark depredation)
 - Requires consideration of (1) burden on constituents, (2) burden on software developers (NMFS does not pay app vendors), (3) how data will be used, and (4) legal considerations


< 2021: Total SEFHIER Data






2022 South Atlantic (SA) SEFHIER Data


SA Permitted Vessels

SEFHIER Reports (from SA For-hire Permitted)




SA Permitted Vessels Fishing vs Not Fishing






2022 SA SEFHIER Data: Total Logbooks, by Month






2022 SA SEFHIER: % Compliant vs Non-Compliant Vessels (With Regard to the Reporting Requirements)






2022 SA SEFHIER: % of Permitted Vessels Reporting vs Not










% of Non-Compliant


*Late = transmission > submission deadline (i.e., Tuesday 11:59 pm, following the reporting week)






2022: Late Reporting (% of logbooks submitted > 30 days of Trip End)


South Atlantic Program (~2200 permits)




Gulf Program (~1300 permits)



2022 SA SEFHIER: Comparison of Gulf to South Atlantic Compliance, with Regard to the Reporting Requirements






2022 SA SEFHIER: Frequency of Values Reported, for Economic Data Fields










2022 SA SEFHIER Spatial Analysis:

2022 SA SEFHIER: Key Takeaways

- Overall, poor SA SEFHIER program compliance; inability to determine accuracy of submitted data
 - > 54% of vessels are missing reports, as of October 2023 (when data was pulled)
 - ➤ Month-to-month, 20-40% of SA SEFHIER permitted vessels are missing reports
 - > ~85% of DNFs and ~55% of logbooks were submitted after the submission deadline
 - ➤ A high number of DNF's are submitted at permit renewal (may indicate misreporting)
 - >32% of logbooks were submitted >30 days of trip ending (i.e., unusable)



SEFHIER Program Data Usage

- South Atlantic For-Hire Amendment was approved but, given concerns over the program requirements, SEFSC noted the following caveats for data usage:
 - Collected data will only provide minimum estimates of fishing effort, which could be used to validate the Marine Recreational Information Program (MRIP) charter estimates
 - Collected data would not be considered useful for providing official estimates of catch and effort for the for-hire fishery until:
 - ✓ Catch is reported prior to offload, so that it can be independently verified;
 - ✓ Multiple years of side-by-side comparisons to MRIP survey have been conducted;
 - ✓ Monitoring and improving compliance over time;
 - ✓ Then, develop statistically robust estimation procedures



SA SEFHIER: Suggested Next Steps

- To improve compliance, the Council should consider adding the following requirements:
 - Submit logbooks within 1 hour of returning to the dock or before offloading fish
 - Declarations for every for every for-hire fishing trip
 - A comprehensive, trip validation program (if no VMS)
 - Limited access, for-hire permits
