# South Atlantic and Gulf Reporting Program

- Owner or operator of a charter vessel with a Federal charter vessel/headboat permit will be required to submit an electronic report for each fishing trip.
- South Atlantic: Submit reports weekly, no later than the Tuesday of the following week.
- Gulf of Mexico: Submit reports before offloading, hail-out, and location tracking device.
- Must report regardless of where they are fishing, catch.
- Vessels with both permits, must follow Gulf requirement *regardless of where they are fishing*



## **Implementation Timeline**

Final Rule Published February 24

> Correction Notice Published August 7

> > Outreach Ongoing

> > > SA Final Rule Effective Date January 4, 2021

Gulf in 2 phases: (1) Logbooks and hail-out effective: January 5, 2021 (2) Position reporting effective: TBD



### **Behind the Scenes**

- Working SEFSC to build a web-based application that will allow us to check for compliance and review the data for QA/QC in real time.
  - Based on the application developed for the Headboat Survey.
  - Late or missing reports will be flagged and the Compliance team will reach out to fishermen.
  - It will run nightly validation checks, flag errors, and the QA/QC team will reach out to fishermen to confirm data or make corrections.
- We are adding staff: QA/QC team (4), monitoring team (3), compliance tracking team (3), and customer service support (2).
