<u>Final</u> SUMMARY REPORT SOUTH ATLANTIC FISHERY MANAGEMENT COUNCIL Full Council Session I (Closed Session) June 10, 2024

The Council met in Closed Session on Monday, June 10, 2024, and discussed the following items:

Legal Briefing

Monica Smit-Brunello, NOAA General Counsel, provided the Council a legal brief relative to recent litigation affecting federal fisheries management.

Review of Applications and Recommendations for Appointment

The Council reviewed the recommendation for the SCDNR designee on the Recreational Permitting and Reporting Advisory Panel.

The Council reviewed applicants for open seats on the SEDAR Pool, Scientific and Statistical Committee (SSC) and various advisory panels. The Council provided recommendations for new appointments and reappointments.

For-Hire Reporting Advisory Panel

The Council reviewed the draft structure and timing for appointments and discussed the draft charge for the new advisory panel.

The Council provided the following comments and recommendations:

- The charge should include improving compliance with existing reporting requirements and any new requirements that may be considered.
- Add "compliance" to the second to last sentence of the charge.
- Solicit for candidates who are familiar with other reporting programs.
- The AP will be temporary and *ad hoc*, not permanent.
- Candidates will be sought through an open solicitation and by recommendation of Council members.
- Potentially include someone from the Gulf region that is not necessarily dually permitted.
- The number of seats is not fixed.

REVISED STRUCTURE OF THE AP:

- Where appropriate, all members would be for-hire federally permitted captains that report through SEFHIER (i.e., possess a USCG Captain's license and own, operate, or be a hired captain of a for-hire fishing business)
- At least 2 members from each South Atlantic state.
 - At least 1 member from each state selected from a SAFMC finfish AP (Snapper Grouper, Mackerel Cobia, or Dolphin Wahoo.)
 - At least 1 member not on an existing finfish AP.
- At least one member from each of the SAFMC finfish APs
- At least 1 member from the New England region.

- At least 1 member from the Mid-Atlantic region.
- At least 1 member from the Gulf of Mexico Region.
- At least 1 member dually permitted between the Gulf of Mexico and South Atlantic.
- At least 1 member dually permitted between the South Atlantic and Greater Atlantic Region.
- At least 1 member dually permitted to fish in a for-hire and commercial capacity.

REVISED CHARGE FOR THE AP:

The For-hire Reporting AP is tasked with providing stakeholder insight on improving the Southeast For-Hire Integrated Electronic Reporting (SEFHIER) Program for the charter and headboat components of the federal recreational Snapper Grouper, Dolphin Wahoo, and Coastal Migratory Pelagic fisheries, particularly improving compliance with existing requirements and any potential new requirements. The AP should consider lessons learned from self-reporting programs and discuss strategies that would enhance timeliness, accuracy, and quality of the data for SEFHIER. The AP should also consider ways to balance data and compliance needs with the reporting burdens associated with any recommendations that are put forward.

2023 Law Enforcement Officer of the Year

The Council reviewed nominees submitted for the Council's Law Enforcement Officer of the Year Award and provided recommendations.

SEDAR 90 (SA Red Snapper) and SEDAR 94 (Hogfish) Participants and Observers

The Council reviewed proposed participants and observers for upcoming SEDAR stock assessments and provided recommendations.
