# Habitat Protection and Ecosystem-Based Management Advisory Panel Meeting May 11-12, 2016 Hilton Garden Inn North Charleston, South Carolina

The Habitat Protection and Ecosystem-Based Management Advisory Panel met May 11-12, 2016 at the Hilton Garden Inn, in Charleston, SC. Issues addressed during the meeting included: 1) Status Report on FEP II Development; 2) South Atlantic Renewable Energy Activities; 3) Potential Effects of Sound on Marine Fishes; 4) Impacts of Seismic Testing on Fish and Habitat; South Atlantic Landscape Conservation Cooperative Regional Conservation Blueprint Development and Training Session; 5) Regional Modeling and Tools; 6) Advances in Navy Research in the South Atlantic Region; 7) Demolition and Artificial Reef Development of Navy Towers off North Carolina and Georgia; 8) NMFS Habitat Conservation Division Report- Miami Harbor Deepening; 9) NOAA NMFS Climate Science Strategy: Collaborative Development of a South Atlantic Regional Action Plan (RAP); and 10) Artificial Reef Policy Statement Development.
