## EFH 5-year review



The Report from the National Essential Fish Habitat Summit published in 2017 states that: The objective of the review, commonly referred to as the "EFH five-year review," is to evaluate and synthesize new information on habitat and determine whether changes to the FMPs are warranted. The EFH five-year review will evaluate published scientific literature, unpublished scientific reports, information solicited from interested parties, and previously unavailable or inaccessible data. If the Council or NOAA Fisheries finds that an update is warranted, FMP amendments will be initiated, along with the appropriate analytical documents.
