The Committee approved minutes from the December 2016 meeting and the agenda.

White Paper on HMS General Category Permit Holders' Compliance with USCG Commercial Vessel Safety Exam Requirements

Council staff provided a summary presentation on HMS general category permits and permit holders that have not received a commercial fishing vessel safety exam from the U.S. Coast Guard, which is required by federal law for all vessels fishing commercially outside of 3 miles from shore. The Committee discussed the presented material, with members noting that the dual commercial and recreational purpose of the HMS Charter/Headboat permit creates ambiguity when determining which vessels are non-compliant and that there is inequity between permit holders that are and are not complying with the requirement.

The Committee approved the following motion:

MOTION #1. DIRECT STAFF TO WRITE A LETTER TO HMS STATING COMMENTS IN SUPPORT OF SPLITTING HMS CHARTER/HEADBOAT PERMIT INTO RECREATIONAL ONLY AND A PERMIT THAT ALLOWS SALE.
