Dumping and Anti-Dumping Laws

- Dumping refers to imports that are sold in the U.S. at less than a fair value.
- Under the Tariff Act of 1930, U.S. industries may petition the government for relief from dumping.
- The U.S. Department of Commerce determines if dumping is occurring. Investigations into occurrences of dumping are conducted by the U.S. International Trade Commission (USITC).

2023 American Shrimp Processors Association (ASPA) Petition

- In October 2023, the ASPA submitted a <u>petition</u> to the International Trade Commission (ITC) for support from imports (specifically from Ecuador, India, Indonesia, and Vietnam) that they believed are undercutting the domestic market.
- In December 2023, the ITC made a preliminary decision that there was "reasonable indication that the domestic industry is materially injured or threatened with injury by imports from the four countries." 1.
- Final results of the investigation is expected fall of 2024.

NOAA Seafood Import Monitoring Program (SIMP)

- Established **reporting** and **record keeping requirements** for imports of 13 species (shrimp included December 31, 2018) to combat the following from entering U.S. commerce:
 - Illegal imports
 - Unreported
 - Unregulated-caught and/or misrepresented seafood
- NOAA uses the International Trade Data System to trace these species back to the point of harvest or production and verify whether they were lawfully harvested or produced.

State Action: Disaster Declaration

SAFMC December 2023 Meeting: In response to requests for a fishery disaster declaration for the shrimp fishery the states within the region noted the following:

FLORIDA: At the December 2023 meeting it was noted that Florida was working on a letter that is expected to be signed by all Gulf states.

March 2024: Letter has not yet been sent.

GEORGIA: Not requesting disaster declaration for the shrimp fishery but instead wrote a letter focusing on shrimp imports.

SOUTH CAROLINA: The South Carolina Shrimpers Association is active and discussing this issue.

March 2024: SC is currently seeking disaster funds and requesting proposals for infrastructure projects.

NORTH CAROLINA: Still determining whether a request will be made.
