Dr. Jack McGovern Bob Gill Phil Steele Martha Bademan The Law Enforcement Committee of the South Atlantic Fishery Management Council convened in the Vienna Ballroom of the Renaissance Orlando Airport Hotel, Orlando, Florida, June 14, 2012, and was called to order at 2:52 o'clock p.m. by Chairman Duane Harris.

MR. HARRIS: Let's go ahead and convene the Law Enforcement Committee of the South Atlantic Fishery Management Council. The first item on the agenda is the approval of the agenda. There is one modification to the agenda that was added after the briefing book was sent out and that is under other business.

That is a law enforcement issue associated with the annual mutton snapper spawning event in the Florida Keys, if we could just add that to the agenda. Is there anything else to add to the agenda? Seeing nothing, is there any objection to approving the agenda as published with that one modification? Seeing none, the agenda is approved.

The next item is the approval of the March 2012 Law Enforcement Committee Minutes. Are there any changes or additions or corrections to those minutes? Seeing none, is there any objection to approving those minutes as published? Seeing none, the minutes are approved. The third item on the agenda is we asked that our law enforcement officers give us an update on law enforcement efforts with respect to the deepwater MPAs. This afternoon Otha and Rob are going to give us updates on that issue. Who is going first?

MR. EASLEY: This will be fortunately a quick one. What I have are just results. Also, to reiterate what has been said before, when the MPAs were first originally put out there and that is that they are out there, enforcement is going to be difficult and tough to be out there with any particular frequency that you might have expected.

With my saying that, just pleasantly surprised, the Coast Guard is out there more often than I envisioned, but you'll hear that report in just a moment. As far as results, over the last few years we have made three cases out there at the MPAs as far as going through the cases that have been, say, good enough, significant enough to make it through general counsel.

Those have been at the Snowy Wreck MPA in 2009 for possession of snapper grouper at that Snowy Wreck; and then also the same MPA also in 2009, also possessing South Atlantic snapper grouper. The various fines were \$500 worth of their fish seized and \$1,000 NOVA in the first case. In the second case their fish were seized, \$225 worth, and a \$1,000 NOVA was issued.

The more recent case here in 2011, which is still not closed yet, this alleged violator has requested a hearing, but at this point he is requesting a hearing as a result of receiving \$11,250 NOVA for possessing snapper grouper in the North Florida MPA. As far as his catch, at that particular time was about \$300 worth of fish. That was at least at this point seized and we'll see what happens after the hearing, if there is an appeal or his hearing is successful or not. That is pretty much the report that I have from OLE at least.

When we do get out there, we are usually on a U.S. Coast Guard platform or more likely on one of the state platforms. We don't have – they are not here to report on their efforts out there, but usually the results of their efforts come to NOAA, anyway, nine out of ten times, for prosecution,

and it would have been included in one of these three. As a matter of fact, the latest one in 2011 is a case that was initiated by FWC. That pretty much ends my report on activity for OLE with regards to MPAs.

MR. HARRIS: Thanks, Otha. Were any of those recreational fishers that were caught in the MPAs fishing illegally or are they all commercial or were they all recreational?

MR. EASLEY: I believe these are all commercial.

MR. HARRIS: Okay, other questions for Otha? Mel.

MR. BELL: Just a technical question; can you make a case from doing an overflight with an air asset? If you see somebody with gear in the water and can identify the boat; is that grounds enough to move on?

MR. EASLEY: Karen can give you a detailed answer to that, but the simple answer is, no, we need more than that at least at this point.

MR. HARRIS: Other questions for Otha? Seeing none, we'll move right into the Coast Guard; Rob.

LT. FOOS: Good afternoon, everybody. My name is Lieutenant Rob Foos, for those that don't know me. I'm finishing up my tour as the District Seven Living Marine Resources Officer. I have a very brief presentation on our MPA enforcement as well as cases that we have prosecuted. For those that don't know, this is basically the bounds of the Seventh District.

We have about 18,000 miles of coastline that we are responsible for that spans from the North and South Carolina border off the west coast of Florida as well as Puerto Rico and then throughout the rest of the Caribbean. Those circles on the screen, those are where our sectors are located.

Sectors tend to be where concentrations of Coast Guard forces are located. The green diamonds are where air stations are located. We have four air stations located throughout the Seventh District. Finally, those little triangles are either patrol boats or small boat stations and where they are located throughout the coast.

For the northern part of the South Atlantic Council's area of responsibility off the coast of South Carolina and North Carolina, I can't speak for the Snowy Grouper Wreck because that is outside of the Seventh District's AOR; however, I can speak to the MPAs that are located off the South Carolina coast. On the left you'll see some of the Coast Guard assets that we have that patrol those MPAs.

Typically, it is an 87-foot patrol boat, and the 87-foot patrol boats in that area are out of - we have one out of Charleston as well as one out of Savannah. They get out and do a pattern that looks more or less like this triangle right here about every other week, sometimes a little bit more than that. One to two times a month they are making a patrol of those offshore MPAs.

I have a star right here in the northern South Carolina MPA, because we prosecuted a case in January or February where a commercial fisherman was anchored 1,000 yards within the northern South Carolina MPA with about 600 pounds of vermilion snapper on board. That was the first case that I'm aware of that we had prosecuted at least certainly within this past year. I couldn't find any others in my records.

In the fall we conducted an operation in this area utilizing one of our major cutters. It was a 270foot major cutter, and they also had C-130 air support to identify targets of interest and then the major cutter conducted boardings. They did a total of six boardings over the course of three days. The weather was pretty snotty.

Off the coast of Florida we have two patrol boats in the Sector Jacksonville AOR; one is out of Jacksonville and the other is out of Cape Canaveral. They get out to the North Florida MPA about once a month. To highlight a little bit what Otha had said about the further offshore the MPAs are, the less frequently we get out to them, my station in Lake Worth gets out to the St. Lucie Hump about 15 to 17 times per month.

And then we have a station in Islamorada that gets out to the East Hump about three times a week, which goes to make sense. The closer in, the more frequently we're able to hit it; however, I don't have any particular cases to highlight for those MPAs. That concludes my MPA brief pending further questions.

MR. HARRIS: Thank you, Rob; questions for Rob? Mel.

MR. BELL: Same thing, when I asked you that; I guess it's the same answer is you can't – from an air asset, I guess you can use that as Intel to put a surface asset on something, but you can't collect enough information to do anything with it other than to direct another asset?

LT. FOOS: Correct, it is basically the same answer that Otha gave. We have to have some sort of end game. An air asset provides great Intel and provides great support for a case package; however, we cannot prosecute a case solely upon that kind of Intel.

MR. CURRIN: I don't have a question, Rob, but just a word of thanks to you. I'm impressed by the frequency with which you guys get out and patrol these areas that are closer to shore. That is real good news for me. Thank you.

MR. HARRIS: Yes, it would be nice if the general public knew how often they are out there and the fact that their being on site on occasion would be a deterrent to illegal activity in these areas, I would think. David.

MR. CUPKA: Robert, has there been any discussion about the use of things like drones to any enforcement activities? I know they use them for border patrols and immigration things. It seems to me one time that one of the Coast Guard people did mention that they were looking at something like that; I'm not sure.

LT. FOOS: That is funny that you mention that; we actually had a case last month. A CBP operates a UAS out of Cape Canaveral, and they operate extensively in that area. They highlighted a target of interest that was going through the Oculina Bank, and they suspected that they may have been illegally fishing. We conducted a boarding prior to that vessel hitting the pier and it turned out that the vessel was perfectly fine. They didn't have any illegal catch on board. But, yes, we do get some cues from the UAS that operates out of Cape Canaveral.

MR. BELL: I'm not belaboring this, but the trick with these MPAs, what we hear is always enforcement, enforceability, enforceability, and because of the remoteness, particularly up our way, way offshore – and I don't know how the law is actually written, but it would seem if a vessel were identifiable and videotaped in the water, in the site, with gear deployed, it seems like that is not apparently a violation. It may be the way the law is written.

I understand the need to make contact with them; but if that is just a limitation of the way the law is written, it is going to be kind of problematic in terms of effective enforcement particularly of these MPAs that are way offshore. I mean, you can put drones up, you can have 130s up, whatever, but all it is, is basically Intel to try to put another asset on it. It just makes it really difficult, but maybe that is just the way the law is constructed, I guess.

MR. HARRIS: Are there any further questions for Otha or Rob? If not, then I'm going to ask Karen Raine – she has volunteered to come up and give us a briefing on South Atlantic cases and NOVAs over the last six months.

MS. RAINE: I thought you might just like a little update on NOVAs that have been issued since last November and the types of cases that at least are coming into my office. On NOVAs, monetary penalties were issued in ten cases since last November; eight of them were recreational and two of them were commercial.

For the recreational the types of violations we're seeing – and often there might be more than one violation in a single case – involved red snapper closed season, fish fillets, black sea bass closed season, bag limit and size limit issues, undersized gag grouper, and gag grouper and vermilion snapper closures.

The penalties ranged in these recreational catches from \$900 to \$5,500. I know in December there was a question about how we do on collection. I'll just let you know that in one of the cases, one of the eight recreational cases, it was just recently issued and so the time in which to respond to the NOVA hasn't expired.

In five of the cases we have received the full amount of the NOVA that was issued. In two of the cases we were able to settle with some of the respondents, but not all of them. Those that we weren't able to settle with have gone to the collection route. Basically, except for the new case, in the other seven we have received, if not the full amount, some amount.

Then there were two commercial cases; one involved a red snapper closed season violation as well as some fillets of vermilion and red snapper and an undersized gag. That was \$1,000

penalty that was paid. Then Otha mentioned the North Florida MPA violation. The NOVA was \$11,250. A hearing has been requested on that and we haven't finished that yet.

MR. HARRIS: Thank you, Karen. Questions? Otha.

MR. EASLEY: My earlier report was just numbers on just the MPAs. I'll give you some overall numbers for the Southeast Division if you wanted to hear those.

MR. HARRIS: Go ahead.

MR. EASLEY: We've had 320 incidents – when by incidents, actions of interest that have caused us to look into them; and of those 320, 179 of those turned into cases, full-blown cases. Karen gave you the numbers as far as NOVAs. Not all of the 179 cases have gone to general counsel, some have gone to U.S. Attorneys, and some have been pretty much closed out because of lack of resources in one office or another, mine or joint counsels.

Also that 320, 156 of those incidents were in – this is just since October 1st to date – were in the South Atlantic. We also have given 59 verbal and/or written warnings; 23 of those 59 were in the area of turtle excluder device enforcement. Those numbers incorporate more than just South Atlantic issues dealing with MPAs and ESA and Magnuson and Sanctuary violations also, not to mention imports and Lacey Act and HMS. It's all mixed up in there. That's it.

LT. FOOS: Mr. Chairman, I'll throw on some numbers, too. So far FY-12 to date, that is from October 1st on, the Coast Guard has conducted 540 fisheries boardings in federal waters, of which eight were designated as significant violations, which include a couple Lacey Act violations involving illegal conch being brought from the Bahamas, as well as a couple of illegal red snapper cases.

MR. HARRIS: Thank you, guys, and I know I speak for the entire council when I say we really appreciate the job you all do. It is a tough, tough job, and we understand how tough it is. Even though we sometimes develop fishery management plans that have recommended management actions that are difficult to enforce, we understand they are difficult to enforce, but there is a segment of the public that is going to abide by those laws even if they are difficult to enforce.

Your presence out there makes it all worthwhile, so thanks very much for the job you do and the joint enforcement agreement officers as well. The next item on the agenda let me digress. I forgot to mention something right at the beginning. This is not Myra. Myra is normally the staff support for the Law Enforcement Committee, but most of you probably know that her husband and son were involved in an accident in South Carolina this morning.

He called her and said they are both okay, but it is a head-on collision. It totaled their new car, so they are lucky to be okay, but she had to hurry home. Anyway, keep Myra and her family in your thoughts and prayers and Bob can probably do the job. We'll see by the end of this committee meeting.

The next item on the agenda is a discussion of the selection of the 2011 Law Enforcement Officer of the Year. We are going to kind of change the way we had planned to do this originally. The Law Enforcement Advisory Panel has recommended three officers.

They did not rank those officers, and I'm going to read you a very short summary of the accomplishments of each of those three. Then I would refer you to the briefing book for the detailed nominations for all three. One is from North Carolina, one is from South Carolina, and one is from Florida.

What we are going to do is I'm not going to ask the committee for a recommendation today. It is very difficult to discuss this in a public setting, and we just decided what we'll do with recommendation and concurrence of the Chair is we have a secret ballot with all three names on it. At the Full Council meeting we'll pass out that ballot and vote on those.

I want you all to take the time to read those nominations and make an informed decision when we come to full council. If you will, let me go over those three nominees. Officer Jonathan Hall is with the North Carolina Division of Environment and Natural Resources. Officer Hall developed several cases working on a joint operation with the South Carolina DNR resulting in both criminal and civil penalties for selling seafood without the proper license.

He also uncovered a North Carolina dealer that was misreporting catches. Officer Hall has worked hard to develop a good working relationship with the local law enforcement in South Carolina DNR enforcement. He has made several cases against recreational fishermen for the sale of bag limit snapper grouper species and dolphin and wahoo.

Officer Hall is always looking for innovative ways to observe fishing activities. He has consistently been a top performer in setting up undercover sting operations related to the backdoor sale of seafood. Officer Hall received a safety and heroism award prior to his joining District Three for a rescue at sea. That is Officer Hall from North Carolina.

Investigator Jill Isaac with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission; before earning a promotion to investigator in January of 2012, Isaac was a permanent crew member aboard the PVC Hawk, Fish and Wildlife Commission's offshore patrol vessel assigned to the JEA for Duval and Nassau counties.

Isaac quickly became recognized as an expert in the enforcement of federal fisheries regulations and often identifying procedures that could be improved upon and providing solutions. She developed new methods for streamlining the recording of information to successfully prosecute federal fisheries cases.

Throughout 2011 Investigator Isaac was involved in numerous other cases aboard the Sea Hawk, but her focus on JEA patrol and activity off the Sea Hawk is particularly noteworthy. When not patrolling on the Sea Hawk, she assumed patrols with other officers or conducted dockside inspections often resulting in the documentation of violations.

Sergeant Steven Pop, South Carolina Department of Natural Resources; Sergeant Pop made 18 federal fishery cases that were charged in state court and three cases that were charged in federal court. Sergeant Pop conducted 249 JEA hours, mostly enforcing commercial regulations. Pop has monitored commercial dive boats over the past four years; and after an extensive investigation, he and an officer in training apprehended the offenders who are believed to have been offloading illegal catch during late night hours for years.

Thanks to Sergeant Pop's commitment to the investigation, the violators were prosecuted in state court. Sergeant Pop also apprehended two commercial snapper grouper vessels that were later charged with several federal violations.

That is a summary of the three nominees as recommended by our Law Enforcement Advisory Panel. Does everybody understand what we are going to do at full council? We have a ballot that will have that summary that I just read, and it will have a place for you to check the person that you would select for the Law Enforcement Officer of the Year, and the award will be presented at the September meeting. Remember, we presented it in December this past year, because we were a little bit late in getting everything together, but from now on the plan is to present it in September. David.

MR. CUPKA: I was going to mention that, but also I will announce the winner at this meeting, but we will actually have them there at September for the actual presentation. We will know who the winner is before you go home.

MR. HARRIS: Great, thank you. Mac.

MR. CURRIN: I don't know that it is an issue, but it could be if the vote comes out tied in some way. We might consider having a ranking sort of pick a first and a second choice; so that if there is a tie you could go to that second choice; some kind of methodology to do that that would prevent having to revote and eliminate people and whatever else.

MR. HARRIS: Great suggestion. David, are you okay with that?

MR. CUPKA: Yes, I was just thinking there was no way for a tie with 13 voting members, but we have more than 13 council members. I don't know if we discussed whether it was just voting members or all council members. We have like Wilson; but if it was voting members, at 13 I don't see how we'd have a tie.

MR. CURRIN: You could, in fact, David, because you've got three candidates, so if one person got three, for example, and two people got five, then there would be a tie for first place. I don't know that it's likely, but it depends on how much time you want to spend voting.

MR. HARRIS: We believe that it needs to be voting members of the council, so there will be 13 potentially voting members. I do think it is a good idea to maybe put your first and second choice down on your ballot. Just put a one by one of them and a two by the other one; how does that sound? Is that complicated, I know, do you want to have a subcommittee? Okay, is there anything else on the Law Enforcement Officer of the Year award?

The last issue is the issue of mutton snapper spawning off the Florida Keys. One of the NMFS Law Enforcement agents – and Otha is aware of this, because we asked that he make sure Otha was aware of it – contacted Myra and she set up a conference call with me to discuss this issue with this person.

Mutton snapper spawn the first full moon in May in waters off the Florida Keys and there are a couple of areas where they spawn. We had some photographs of the boats out there in these areas, and it is pretty impressive the number of boats. These areas are very close to shore. The law enforcement issue is people making multiple trips during a single day and catching more than the daily bag limit of mutton snapper.

Of course, they are hammering on these fish when they are in spawning condition. It is an issue. I'm not going to ask the Law Enforcement Committee to make any recommendations or take any action on that issue today. I think this is an issue that needs to be referred to our Snapper Grouper Committee for further consideration.

There is a report that was e-mailed to you and was not in your briefing book, but it was e-mailed to everyone after the briefing book was mailed. You do have a report entitled "Mutton Snapper Spawn Issues Paper" that details all these issues. Unless the committee wants to take any action, I think it's more appropriate that this be an action for the Snapper Grouper Committee.

I would ask that they put that on their agenda to discuss as soon as possible. Jessica may want to add something else to it. They have had similar concerns expressed by their law enforcement officers. Jessica, do you want to discuss this issue a minute?

MS. McCAWLEY: Yes, we're aware of the issue. We've been working with our law enforcement and we agree it seems like people are making multiple trips to the area. I'm not sure what the appropriate solution is, possibly just a spawning season closure in that one little area and not throughout mutton snapper range would be part of the answer; maybe a reduced bag limit during certain times of the year, I'm not sure exactly what is best.

I think that whatever the council does it will have to be done in coordination with the FWC, because part of the area is in federal waters and part is in state waters. I also understand from talking to Sean Morton with the Sanctuary, that the Sanctuary is also considering some sort of an action, whether it would be an area closure or something for that particular area, but we know that their timeline is not until 2014 for them to complete their process.

MR. HARRIS: Thank you, and, of course, they would have to come through the council for any fisheries activity enforcement or activities, anyway. Questions about the mutton snapper spawning issue? Mac?

MR. CURRIN: Not really, Mr. Chairman, I was just going to offer a motion, if you needed one, to refer this issue to the Snapper Grouper Committee.

MR. HARRIS: You are welcome to make a motion. There is a motion, is there a second; second by John Jolley. Discussion on the motion? Is there any objection to the motion? Seeing none,

that motion is approved. That does complete our timing and task motion. Okay, get that motion up there. I told him we weren't going to have any motions so you caught him off guard, but that's okay. Make your motion again, if you don't mind, Mac.

MR. CURRIN: Duane the motion was to refer the mutton snapper spawning season issue to the Snapper Grouper Committee.

MR. HARRIS: It was seconded by John Jolley. Okay, did we vote on it already?

MR. CURRIN: If you want some rationale for that, Duane, it is because I won't be there.

MR. HARRIS: That's unacceptable rationale; I'm sorry, you're out of order now. Okay, any other issues to come before the Law Enforcement Committee? We know what our timing and task is, so, okay, we stand adjourned, Mr. Chairman.

(Whereupon, the meeting was adjourned at 3:25 o'clock p.m., June 14, 2011.)
