



- Better Data
- Current survey MRIP
 - ▶10% For hire fleet
 - Interviews via phone calls and dock intercepts
 - Long reporting time period
 - Estimate based



Purpose of electronic reporting



- Increase accuracy of data
- Near real time data are available
- Census based data
- In season data sets more complete
- No legibility issues
- ▶ Reduce recall bias due to quicker reporting time

Who it applies to



- Federally Permitted Charter/Head boat vessels
 - Headboats
 - Currently report to the Southeast region headboat survey
 - ▶ Need to report on a more rapid basis
 - Charter boats
 - Need to begin reporting via a NMFS approved reporting system
 - Trip level information submitted on a weekly basis



What should be reported: Identifiers

- Captain ID
- Vessel ID
- Number of crew
- Number of anglers












What should be reported: Trip Details



- Start Date and Time of Trip
- Start and end location (port)
- Hours within the trip fished
- Location of fishing
- Average depth fished (can be a range)
- End Date and Time of Trip



What should be reported: Catch Details







- Target Species (can be categories or groups)
- All species caught
- Number of each species kept
- Number of each species released





What should be reported: Economic Information

tishery Manager Council



- Charter fee
- Fuel used
- Cost of fuel (per gallon)









Did Not Fish Days



- AKA "no fishing reports"
- A report saying that they did not fish at all
- Can be reported in advance for multiple days
- Looks like "negative reports"



Geographic differences: Mid-Atlantic



- ▶ Have been required to report since March 2017
- Must have a VTR filled out before entering port
- Must electronically report within 24 hours of each trip
- Must have records of past reports on boat



Geographic differences: Mid Atlantic – enforcement issues



► Fishermen with both South Atlantic and Mid Atlantic Federal permits will be required to report the South Atlantic Data points, on the Mid Atlantic Timeline.

- Regional Boundary Issues
 - Mid-Atlantic management starts north of Cape Hatteras for black sea bass and scup
 - ▶ Blue fish are always under mid-Atlantic management





- Hail-out with expected return date/time and location
- Permanently affixed GPS device that is always "on"
- Landings must be reported prior to offload of fish
- Headboats must report more rapidly



Geographic differences: Gulf – enforcement issues



- If the SAFMC amendment is implemented first, charter captains must first meet South Atlantic requirements (regardless of fishing location)
 - ► Then, when Gulf amendment is implemented, charter captains will need to meet the Gulf reporting requirements (regardless of fishing location)
- ▶ If the Gulf's amendment is implemented first, or at the same time as the South Atlantic, charter captains must meet the Gulf reporting requirements (regardless of fishing location)

- Regional boundary
 - Gulf management begins NW of HWY 1
 - Excluding hogfish (SA management ends at Cape Sable) and king mackerel (mixing zone)



Top 5 concerns from fishermen



- Economic questions
- Personal cost
- Why should I report
- How/who will use data
- Enforcement Details



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Economic questions



- "Your job is to manage fisheries not fishermen"
- Management is legally required to take economic information into account
- ► This is just a snap shot of what the economic impact of charter fishermen is on the fishery
- Will be private and secure
- Disaster studies, for example with hurricanes, can be conducted faster if researchers already have a pool of data

Personal cost



- "What is this gonna cost me"
- ▶ The app is free
- Just need an electronic tool (a phone, tablet or computer)
- ▶ Takes about 10 minutes (less with practice)

Why Report



- "Why should I report accurately? Why shouldn't I lie"
- Better data requires accurate and honest reporting
- If a fishermen want more accurate management decisions, then managers need to base their decisions on accurate data






- ▶ 24/7 Helpdesk











Public hearing; Council reviews and comments modifies amendment



Council chooses preferred alternatives, submits approves amendment and it to NOAA



December 2016

NOAA review and publication of Notice of Availability and the proposed rule



April 2018

Public comment period: Notice of Availability and Proposed Rule



Closed May 2018

Secretary of Commerce approved the amendment June 2018






- Law enforcement mobile application information –

Look for the last positive or negative report date







