My name is Brendan Runde, and I'm a marine scientist with the Nature Conservancy. I first would like to comment on Secretarial Amendment 59. While I think we all would like to see a future where there are increases in allowable catch of red snapper, I am concerned with the route that the regional office is taking to achieve that goal. Using recent fishing mortality rates as the proxy for Fmsy sets a dangerous precedent that implies that overfishing has ended when, in actuality, the status has not changed. Redefining such an important value should be reviewed and accepted by the SSC prior to use in management. Second, also on Amendment 59, I would like to suggest that the Agency consider including an alternative that would start the recreational red snapper season in May. As currently written, the action would keep the recreational season in July while moving the commercial season to align with the opening of shallow water grouper in May. There is high quality science available, including a 2015 paper by the Council's own staff member Dr. Judd Curtis, showing that discard mortality of this species is higher in the summer when surface temperatures are higher. I am certain that more releases occur during the open season to May would have conservation benefits for red snapper, as those released fish would have a better chance of surviving as compared to a July season.
