This has always been a winter time ,cold dirty water fishery. When the agency closed the bottom inshore of 90 feet during the winter months to vertical line gear for right whale protection it destroyed the fishery. Now we have an opportunity to use the gear with rope less methods. The development of this on demand rope less gear is very important for the future of all vertical line gear types. I have participated in the EFP using on demand rope less devices and have found it to be almost flawless. Fisherman need to be able to continue the development, with the use of this on demand gear as an acceptable gear type for the Commercial BSB pot fishery. Please help and support this amendment.  Amendment 46 The SG/AP has expressed concern with the estimates of recreational catch resulting from the Marine Recreational Information Program (MRIP) including the Fishing effort survey (FES) All informed Stakeholders have been requesting that the Council explore a recreational permit for snapper grouper fishing. This recommendation has also been put forth by You the Council's Snapper Grouper Advisory Panel numerous times. Please continue to develop and implement a Private Recreational S/G permit.  Amendment 47 scoping I would recommend that the S/G for-Hire sector become limited entry and be separated from the private recreational sector.
