Background

 Amendment 43 (2018) implemented a South Atlantic red snapper recreational sector ACL of 29,656 fish

Preliminary 2019 Recreational Landings *landings are in numbers of fish

Preliminary 2019 Recreational Landings = 49,674 Fish which exceeds the Recreational ACL of 29,656 fish. 2019 recreational season was 5 days



2020 Recreational Red Snapper Season Calculation

- Assume 1,000 red snapper are harvested in the recreational sector outside of the federal season.
 29,656 Fish ACL reduced to 28,656 Fish
- Preliminary 2019 landings (49,674 Fish) during the 2019 five day season converts to a catch rate of 9,935 fish a day
- 28,656 fish / 9,935 fish a day = a possible 3 day season
- Since NOAA Fisheries projects that the recreational ACL in 2020 will be met in three days, there will not be a recreational fishing season for red snapper unless Regulatory Amendment 33 is implemented.
