South Atlantic Red Snapper 2022 Recreational Season Update

South Atlantic Council Meeting

March 2022

Background

- SEDAR-24 (2010) and SEDAR 41 (2016) determined stock is Overfished and Undergoing Overfishing.
- Amendment 28 (2013) set recreational season to only be open on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, and begins on second Friday in July. Recreational season prediction must be longer than 3 days or no season.
- Amendment 43 (2018) implemented new Annual Catch Limits (ACL). Recreational ACL is 29,626 fish.
- Regulatory Amendment 33 (2020) removed the requirement that the red snapper season must be 3 days or longer.



Recreational Landings Data Sources in the South Atlantic

- State surveys and carcass programs
- Marine Recreational Information Program (MRIP) recreational survey
- Headboat landings from Southeast Region Headboat Survey (SRHS)



What Recent Landings are Available to Predict 2022 July Landings?

The recreational season begins the second Friday in July each year if a recreational season is allowed.

- Recreational sector was open in July 2019, 2020, and 2021. Before 2019 it was last open in July in 2014.
- 2019: Recreational Season open 5 days. July 12, 13, 14, 19, and 20.
- 2020: Recreational Season open 4 days. July 10, 11, 12, and 17.
- 2021: Recreational Season open 3 days. July 9, 10, and 11.

What July Recreational Landings Data Are Available?

Southeast Fisheries Science Center coordinated an ad-hoc group, which met in 2020 to review the 2019 data (SEDAR 73-WP-10).


