- SEDAR 73 results presented to the Council in June 2021
  - Stock not yet rebuilt and overfishing occurring
- SSC meets in July 2021 and provides catch level recommendations
- Discards identified as a significant issue

## **Additional considerations**

- <u>South Atlantic Red Snapper Research Program</u> scheduled to be completed in fall 2025.
- Red Snapper legislation in October 2023 the House Natural Resources Committee voted to advance the Red Snapper Act.
  - The Act would prevent NOAA from making sweeping changes to Atlantic Red Snapper management until the results of the research program are integrated into stock assessments.
