Dear Dr. Crabtree:

Pursuant to Section 305(c) of the Magnuson-Stevens Act as reauthorized, the Council is requesting a prohibition on harvest and possession of red snapper to be implemented through interim measures. The Council approved the following motion at the March 2009 meeting in Jekyll Island, Georgia: "Request an interim rule to implement no harvest of red snapper in the EEZ off NC, SC, GA & FL [intent to request an extension for a total of a one year closure and to request the states to adopt compatible regulations]."

The Council also passed a motion to request that the Regional Administrator not publish the final rule for the interim rule prior to the June 2009 Council Meeting.

The Council received notification, in a letter dated July 8, 2008, that the South Atlantic red snapper stock is undergoing overfishing and is overfished and that the Magnuson-Stevens Act requires the Council to prepare a plan amendment or proposed regulations to end overfishing within one year. Permanent measures to end overfishing and establish a rebuilding program are being developed in Snapper Grouper FMP Amendment 17. The Council's current schedule is to approve Amendment 17 for public hearings at the June 2009 meeting and to review public input and DEIS comments during the September 2009 meeting. If possible, the Council intends to approve the amendment for formal Secretarial review at the September or December 2009 meeting.
