COMMITTEE REPORT FROM THE SNAPPER GROUPER COMMITTEE St. Simons, GA

March 9-10, 2011

The SAFMC Snapper Grouper Committee met March 9-10, 2011 at St. Simons, GA. The Committee discussed the following items:

Black Sea Bass and Golden Tilefish Issues:

Gregg Waugh, Council Staff, gave the committee an overview of management issues pertaining to black sea bass and golden tilefish and requested guidance on projections for the ongoing SEDAR 25 assessment.

Jack McGovern, SERO Staff, provided an overview of the black sea bass bag limit analysis. The Committee made a series of motions that were subsequently withdrawn or rescinded. The committee discussed adding an action to establish a bag limit for black sea bass under Regulatory Amendment 9.

The Committee made the following motions:

MOTION: ASK THAT THE UPCOMING BLACK SEA BASS ASSESSMENT TAKE A LOOK AT FREBUILD (CONSTANT F) AND CONSTANT CATCH TO REBUILD BY THE END OF 10 YEARS (10-YEAR REBUILDING PERIOD ENDING IN FISHING YEAR 2015/2016)

Regulatory Amendment 11:

The Committee received a presentation from Nick Farmer, SERO staff, on preliminary analyses on the distribution of speckled hind and Warsaw grouper encounters according to various databases. The Committee briefly reviewed the Regulatory Amendment 11 Issues Paper and gave staff guidance on the Purpose and Need. The Committee also provided various alternatives fro inclusion in the developing amendment.

Regulatory Amendment 9:

Myra Brouwer, Council Staff, gave the Committee a summary of public hearing comments on Regulatory Amendment 9. The Committee reviewed all actions in Regulatory Amendment 9 and made the following motions:

Action 1. Harvest Management Measures for Black Sea Bass

MOTION: SELECT ALTERNATIVE 6 AS PREFERRED

Alternative 6. Change the black sea bass fishing year to January-December. Separate commercial ACLs (quotas) for January-June and July-December based on landings from 2006-2009.

MOTION: SELECT ALTERNATIVE 7 AS PREFERRED

Alternative 7. Under Alternatives 3-6, carry over unused portion of commercial ACL quota from first part of fishing year to second portion of season.

MOTION: FOR BOTH SECTORS, ANY UNUSED QUOTA AT THE END OF THE 2011 FISHING YEAR, WOULD BE ADDED TO THE FIRST HALF OF THE FOLLOWING FISHING YEAR (STARTING IN JANUARY 2012)

Sub-Alternative 12a. Implement a March 1-April 30th spawning season closure for black sea bass, would apply to commercial and recreational sectors.

Subalternative 13b. Reduce the recreational bag limit from 15 to 5 black sea bass per person per day.

Subalternative 13c. Reduce the recreational bag limit from 15 to 3 black sea bass per person per day.

Subalternative 13a. Reduce the recreational bag limit from 15 to 2 black sea bass per person per day.

Subalternative 13a. Reduce the recreational bag limit from 15 to 1 black sea bass per person per day.

Comprehensive Annual Catch Limit (ACL) Amendment:

Myra Brouwer, Council Staff, provided a brief overview of public comments received on the amendment. The Committee reviewed all actions in the amendment and made the following motions:

Action 1: Remove Species from Snapper Grouper Fishery Management Unit (FMU)

MOTION: MODIFY ALTERNATIVE 4 TO REMOVE MUTTON SNAPPER FROM THE SNAPPER GROUPER FMU ALONG WITH THE OTHER SPECIES IN ALTERNATIVE 4.

Alternative 4 (Preferred). Remove species from the Snapper Grouper FMU with 80% (or greater) of landings in state waters, except mutton snapper and hogfish.

MOTION: CHANGE PREFERRED ALTERNATIVE TO ALTERNATIVE 1 (NO ACTION)

Action 4: Establish an Acceptable Biological Catch (ABC) Control Rule for Snapper Grouper Species

MOTION: MODIFY ALTERNATIVE 5 UNDER ACTION 4: FOR ASSESSED SPECIES ESTABLISH ABC BASED ON THE SSC CONTROL RULE. FOR UNASSESSED SPECIES ESTABLISH ABC=MEDIAN LANDINGS 1999-2008 AND

OFL=UNKNOWN UNTIL THE SSC CONTROL RULE IS FULLY APPLIED. MAKE THIS THE PREFERRED ALTERNATIVE.

Action 7: Specify Accountability Measures (AMs)/Annual Catch Targets (ACTs) for species in the Snapper Grouper FMU

The committee instructed staff to draft an alternative that would base the trigger for shortening the fishing season on landings trends from the previous five years excluding the maximum and minimum. In addition, the new approach would establish a technical panel to periodically review and evaluate the efficacy of the new approach.

MOTION: DIRECT STAFF TO INCLUDE LANGUAGE TO CLARIFY THAT ADDITIONAL MANAGEMENT MEASURES ARE NOT BEING ESTABLISHED FOR UNASSESSED SNAPPER GROUPER SPECIES IN THIS AMENDMENT APPROVED BY COMMITTEE

Action 10: Specify Accountability Measures (AM) for the Wreckfish Fishery

MOTION: MAKE ALTERANTIVE 2 AN ADDITIONAL PREFERRED.

Alternative 2. For post-season accountability measures, compare recreational ACL with recreational landings over a range of years. For 2011, use only 2011 landings. For 2012, use the average landings of 2011 and 2012. For 2013 and beyond, use the most recent three-year running average.

Action 12: Specify Jurisdictional Allocations for Black Grouper

NOTE: INCREASING ACLS ARE CONTINGENT UPON NOT EXCEEDING THE ANNUAL PROJECTED HARVEST LEVEL

Subalternative 6a (Preferred). If the recreational sector ACL is exceeded, the Regional Administrator shall publish a notice to reduce the recreational sector ACL in the following season by the amount of the overage.

Possible Action on Yellowtail Snapper

The Committee discussed possibly extending management for yellowtail snapper to the Gulf of Mexico and resulting management implications. NOAA GC will provide guidance on whether permitting issues can be resolved in a manner that would allow action to be taken in the Comp ACL Amendment.

Action 18: Establish Annual Catch Limits (ACL) and Optimum Yield (OY) for Dolphin

MOTION: CHANGE THE PREFERRED TO ALTERNATIVE 3

Alternative 3. ACL = OY = 85% of the ABC.

Other Business:

Two items were brought up under Other Business:

- The state of North Carolina is interested in the Council limiting the use of bangsticks off North Carolina due to concerns over localized depletion of some snapper grouper species. An issues paper will be made available to Council members and staff for future consideration under Comprehensive Ecosystembased Amendment 3 or another appropriate amendment.
