Notes on Commercial Landings Data

- Landings were summarized in April 21, 2016. Both 2015 and 2016 landings are preliminary at this time.
- Landings come from in-season monitoring of dealer reported landings.
- Landings are compiled and provided by the Southeast Fisheries Science Center.
- Landings are assigned by fisher reported catch area rather than dealer location

Notes on Recreational Landings Data

- Landings were summarized in April of 2016. Landings for 2015 are preliminary. 2016 recreational landings are not available at this time. Southeast Fisheries Science Center provided the landings.
- Landings were summarized using MRIP or MRFSS (calibrated from MRIP) depending on how the ACL is defined.
- Landings include Headboat landings

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• Landings estimates were updated by NMFS SERO to be consistent with ACL monitoring (e.g., post-stratification of estimates).
