SUBJECT: Preliminary 2009-2010 Commercial Landings

The Southeast Fisheries Science Center has provided the following **preliminary landings estimates** for species in the South Atlantic Fishery Management Council's area of jurisdiction subject to quota management through May 31, 2010.

- Atlantic king and Spanish mackerel data includes preliminary landings through May 15, 2010.
- Atlantic Spanish mackerel quota (%) is based on the adjusted quota of 3,620,000 lbs.
- Given the early closure on the Gulf king mackerel Eastern Zone-East Coast subzone on February 4, 2010, the National Marine Fisheries Service reopened the fishery from March 3–7, 2010.
- The trip limit for golden tilefish was reduced to 300 lbs gutted weight on March 18, 2010, and the fishery closed on April 12, 2010.
- The commercial fishery for black sea bass closed on December 20, 2009.
- Vermilion snapper closed on March 19, 2010.
- Confidential landings.
- The Dolphin Wahoo Fishery Management Plan established a 1.5 million-pound cap for the dolphin commercial fishery for both northeast and southern Atlantic regions. During January 1 through May 31, 2010, 4.91% of the 1.5 million-pound cap was landed (73,711 pounds).
- Octocoral landings are reported twice a year with final landings reported by May of the next year; therefore, these are the total landings for both Atlantic (81 trips) and Gulf (110 trips) in federal waters for 2009, reported in number of colonies.
