Each tab in the story map addresses a different topic being discussed by the Committee. Each section can be printed out individually if you wish to have a hard copy version of the story map.

The "Data" tab contains commercial and recreational landings statistics and economic performance information for Atlantic king and Spanish mackerel. This information is provided to advisory panels prior to completions of Fishery Performance Reports and has been updated and made available in the story map for reference when discussing topics on the Committee agenda. To select information for king and Spanish mackerel navigate to the "Mackerel Update" tab and select king or Spanish mackerel from the drop-down menu on the left.
