

**King Mackerel**

The 2018/2019 ACL for the Atlantic Group was 5,200,000 (Northern Zone = 1,198,080, Southern Zone = 4,001,920). The 2017/2018 ACL for the Atlantic Group was 5,900,000 (Northern Zone = 1,359,360, Southern Zone = 4,540,640).

Originally, the 2017/2018 commercial quota for Atlantic migratory group Spanish mackerel northern zone was 662,670 pounds. However, regulations allow for quota transfers between the northern and southern zones with the approval from the Regional Administrator of NOAA Fisheries to allow the commercial quota for both zones to be fully harvested. 100,000 pounds of Spanish mackerel were transferred from the southern zone quota to the northern zone quota. Therefore, the revised quotas was 2,567,330 pounds for the southern zone and 762,670 pounds for the northern zone. The commercial sector in the Northern Zone closed on November 7, 2017. The commercial sector in the Northern Zone closed on August 24, 2019. The commercial sector for the Southern Zone closed on February 5, 2019. The trip limit for the Atlantic Spanish mackerel was reduced to 1,500 and 500 lbs on December 26, 2018, and January 27, 2019, respectively. During the 2019/2020 fishing season, the trip limit for the Atlantic Spanish mackerel was reduced to 1,500 and 500 lbs on December 24, 2019, and January 29, 2020, respectively. During the 2020/2021 fishing year, the commercial sector in the Northern Zone was closed on July 17, 2020. The commercial sector in the Southern Zone closed on February 3, 2021.

**Cobia – Gulf of Mexico Migratory Group (Florida east coast zone)**

Preliminary landings of Gulf cobia (Florida east coast zone) from the SEFSC Quota Monitoring System as of February 8, 2021. Fishing year begins January 1.
